General Committee for the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss the proposed Town initiated applications to amend the Town of Halton Hills Official Plan and Town of Halton Hills Zoning By-law 2010-0050, as amended.

The proposed Official Plan and Zoning By-law amendment applications apply to the lands legally described as Part Lot 19, Concession 9, Part Lot 37, Plan 32; and Part Lot 2 and Lots 3 to 6, Plan 341, Town of Halton Hills, Regional Municipality of Halton. The subject lands are municipally known as 42 Mill Street & 11 Dayfoot Drive (Georgetown). Below is a map showing the location of the subject property.

The purpose and effect of the applications are to allow for the development of two 5 storey residential buildings and to reconfigure Lions Park.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of the Official Plan and Zoning By-law amendment applications, you must make a written request to the Town of Halton Hills – PLANNING, DEVELOPMENT & SUSTAINABILITY DEPARTMENT at 1 Halton Hills Drive, Halton Hills, Ontario L7G 5G2.

NOTES:
1. If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed Official Plan and/or Zoning By-law amendments are adopted/passed, the person or public body is not

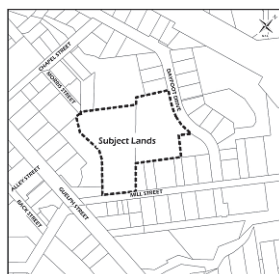
entitled to appeal the decision of the Town of Halton Hills to the Ontario Municipal Board.

- If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or make written submissions to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed Official Plan and/or Zoning By-law amendments are adopted/passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the Board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.
- Any written comment/objection submitted to the Town of Halton Hills regarding these applications which are being processed under the Planning Act 1990, may be made public as part of the application process.
