## Halton Police launching online vulnerable person registry

Halton Police are launching an online Vulnerable Person Registry.

The Registry will provide Halton Police with emergency contact information, detailed physical descriptions, known routines and the special needs of the individual.

The information will assist officers in communicating with, attending a residence of our dealing with an emergency involving the individual.

In October 2014 Police launched the autism on-line registry. The voluntary registry was designed to provide a better system of service delivery to community members by ensuring that front line officers have access to vital information when responding to occurrences involving people with Autism Spectrum Disorder.

Since then, the registry has been opened to other vulnerable groups in efforts to have critical information that may assist police in dealing with vulnerable persons resulting in the Vulnerable Person Registry.

A vulnerable person is defined as a person who due to a medical, mental health or physical condition, may exhibit patterns of behaviour that may pose a danger to themselves or others.

This could include; an inclination to wander, the inability to communicate, fascinations or attractions (water, construction sites, etc.) and social responses (fear of strangers, aggression).

Examples of vulnerable persons include those who have; Alzheimer's disease, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Acquired Brain Injury or a mental condition that causes a person to exhibit the above behaviours.
