Back in action

Tammy Lambert recently demonstrated her Georgetown Creelman Sock Knitting Machine at the Georgetown Farmers' Market. She is making socks using this antique machine. Lambert attends gatherings called "crank-ins" where a group of people with these machines get together. Three quarters of the attendees has a machine manufactured by Creelman — either under the company name of Creelman, Cooperative Knitting Machine Company, Harley-Kay-Marsland, Auto Knitter in Toronto and New York, or PT Legere in Quebec. Left is is a picture of her "Money Maker" machine, which is an early (rare to find) production. From the 1880s to the 1930s the Creelman Brothers produced in a factory on Main St. in Georgetown knitting machines that were famous in factories and homes around the world. One home machine, called The Banner, could make 24-36 pairs of rib socks by hand power or 36 to 48 pairs of rib socks by electric power in 10 hours. Equipped with its own stand, the machine sold for \$90.

mitted to ensuring the Pan Am/Parapan Am Games in Halton will be safe, fun and successful for everyone involved, including our resi-




