

Hospital's baby dept. closed until two obstetricians can be hired

Georgetown Hospital's obstetrical department has been out of the baby delivery business temporarily since December 2014.

The hospital began redirecting obstetrical patients to other area hospitals, primarily Milton District Hospital, due to a physician vacancy and the fact Dr. Selvaratnam Gunaratnum, the hospital's only obstetrician, went on a medical leave in December.

Halton Healthcare Services spokesperson Paul Mc-Ivor said Gunaratnum is recuperating with the intention of resuming his clinical duties, but it's unknown when.

Since the workload is too high for a single doctor the hospital is looking for two obstetricians so obstetrics can be restored.

"We have been actively recruiting suitable candidates for the two obstetrician positions," said Dr. Justin Busse, Associate Chief of Staff.

"We have interviewed several potential candidates and are optimistic that this will lead to us hiring two excellent clinicians to join the Hospital."

"While we do not have a firm date (when obstetrical service would be reinstated) we expect to establish a realistic timeline for resuming obstetrical activities at Georgetown Hospital," said McIvor.

He added there had been no layoffs in the department and staff members have been reassigned to other duties.

"We're currently using the obstetrical unit for medical and surgical patients; staff from the unit continue to provide patient care service to patients," said McIvor.
