A proposed Community Improvement Plan (CIP) has been prepared to apply to Caledon's Six Villages: Alton, Caledon Village, Cheltenham, Inglewood, Mono Mills and Palgrave. The purpose of the CIP is to assist in the promotion of redevelopment, revitalization, beautification, and to enhance each community's unique character. The CIP provides a series of municipal leadership strategies tailored to each Village's needs, a set of financial incentive programs to promote private property improvements, and principles of urban design to guide improvements made under the CIP. The specific areas to which the CIP will apply will be designated by the proposed Community Improvement Project Areas
