## Halton Hills firefighters rescue toddler trapped in burning home

A three-year-old boy appears to be recovering well in a Toronto hospital after a blaze caused major damage to a home on Tanners Dr. in Acton Tuesday afternoon.

Halton Hills firefighters were able to perform a dramatic rescue of the child, identified as Josiah Nguyen, on the second floor of the smoke-filled home just after 2 p.m.

A neighbor attempted to rescue

the victim before members of the HHFD arrived on scene, but he was driven back by thick smoke in a stairwell. The mother also tried to enter the building but was held back by bystanders.

Halton Police officers were the

first on scene to find a working structure fire. Black smoke and flames were observed coming from the upper windows of the residence.
