- halton.ca/childcaresubsidy provides information on how to apply for childcare subsidy for eligible families.
- halton.ca/immunization provides information about immunizations needed for school attendance and the recommended immunization schedule in Ontario.
- hmcconnections.com (formerly known as the Halton Multicultural Council) provides a variety of services

to help newcomers adjust to life in Canada, including counselling and settlement information, help connecting with the community, employment supports, English language training and housing supports.

While there are many services for newcomers to Halton, there are also opportunities for current residents to offer their support.

The Halton Newcomer Strategy (haltonnewcomerstrategy.com) is an advocacy team that engages the community to empower newcomers to Halton and they're always looking for passionate volunteers to help create welcoming neighbourhoods. Halton Region also currently provides specific information for Syrian refugees on its website at halton.ca to help them make a safe and healthy transition into our community.
