A small production company out of Georgetown is organizing a music night showcasing local musicians to collect donations for a local

On March 25, the doors of Nashville North in Norval will open and folk rock bands Jack Pine and Silver Creek Folk will take the stage. Along with the \$5 entrance fee, guests are asked to bring a non-perishable food item as part of payment, which will be donated to the Georgetown Bread Basket.

Last month, organizers at Nashville North approached Douglas Sinclair, the face of

local company Shoe Tree Productions, and asked him if he would be willing to hold a live event to support local musicians. Being in the industry of live music. Sinclair couldn't refuse, and accepted the role as organizer for the event, Live and Local.

"We want to cater to the Georgetown community and also help those in need in the town and get community support," he said.

Sinclair has been organizing music events since his high school days. With his company, he introduces local musicians to the community of Halton Hills by placing them in concerts and selling their merchandise.

"I've been trying to help out bands in the community, and now there's this resource that

doesn't get used that's right in our backyard that has adequate infrastructure to provide an event for bands," he said. "We're just giving it a shot to see if it could be something that could work for all parties."

This is not the first time Sinclair has orga-

nized charity events along a similar thread. Last year, he organized a charity event for Sketch, an organization that focuses efforts on keeping youth off the streets. He also provided music for the Georgetown/Acton ALS Walk that took place last June.

Currently, North is not open on Fridays. With the possibility Live and Local becomes more regular, Sinclair is hopeful a new crowd will frequent the establishment

to enjoy some local, live music.

"The crowd I'm trying to bring in there is not the crowd that usually goes there," he said. "And that's sort of what they want. ... There's a lot of people in town that want to listen to folk music and they want to cater to that."

Live and Local will take place Friday, March 25, with doors opening at 10 p.m. Sinclair invited everyone over the age of 19 to come out, and reminds people not to forget a nonperishable food item to go to the Georgetown Bread Basket.

"They're basically giving me the keys and saving, 'we'd like to help you, but manage this," Sinclair said. "If this does well, it can lead to more opportunities to continue."
