All three play field lacrosse on travelling teams in the U.S., with Mackay suiting up for the Hill Academy, while Channel and Gamble are members of Edge Lacrosse

The HHMLA has had one player drafted in the second round in each of the previous three years: Zack Kearney, Whitby 2017; John Vezina, Kitchener-Waterloo 2016; Cameron Downey, Orangeville 2015.
