

# GET YOUR BUZZ ON: Marijuana terms for newbies

With recreational marijuana use soon to be legal in this country, the newsroom's finest have

happily volunteered to roll up a few stories in the coming weeks in hopes of bringing you up to

speed on all things cannabis. Today's lesson contains the terms, buzz words if you will, that every

newbie should learn if they want to be a pot connoisseur.

**BONG:** A bong is a glass, ce-

ramic, or plastic device that is used to smoke cannabis or extracts. A bong filters smoke through water, cooling it before being inhaled. These devices are used to further purify and cool the smoke.

**BOWL:** The part of a smoking device or pipe where the marijuana is placed.

**BLUNT:** Popular on the police shows, a blunt is made by removing the tobacco from a cigar, and then loading the cigar with marijuana. Blunts are used for holding large amounts of marijuana. A blunt can last up to a half-hour or longer.

**CANNABIDIOL:** Also called CBD, cannabidiol is one of more than 65 molecules called cannabinoids found in the pot plant. CBD has become favoured for its medical benefits and can be used to treat cancer, nausea, pain and seizures. However, unlike THC, CBD has no psychoactive effects and is good for those who want the medical benefits of pot without the impaired feeling. CBD is usually extracted from the pot plant and is made into different medications.

**CANNABINOIDS:** Cannabinoids are compounds that act on the brain's cannabinoid receptors that delay the release of neurotransmitters. Pot products are often infused with CBD to provide stronger effects. CBD is also used to treat Dravet syndrome.

**CLONE:** A clone is a clipping from a pot plant, like granddad's tomatoes, that can be grown, creating a genetic copy of the mother.

#### Study

Halton Region has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) Study for Regional Road 25 from Steeles Avenue (Regional Road 8) to 5 Side Road, in the Town of Milton and Town of Halton Hills. The MCEA Study will consider a wide range of road improvement alternatives as well as intersection improvements, active transportation and overall traffic operations. The impact of road improvements on social, cultural, economic and natural environments will also be evaluated and assessed during the study.

#### Process

The study is being conducted in compliance with Schedule C of the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment* (October 2000, amended 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is approved under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*.

A key component of the study will be consultation with interested stakeholders (public and regulatory agencies) through Public Information Centres (PIC). The first Public Information Centre has been arranged for:
