Retired music teacher facing child sex abuse charges cancels fundraiser concert

Former Georgetown music teacher Dale Wood has cancelled an upcoming show after being charged with three counts of sexual assault and one charge of sexual interference.

The alleged incidents date back to the 1980s, and involve students whom

Wood taught private singing lessons in his home.

Wood was slated to put on a fundraiser concert called "Because of You," on April 8 at Knox Presbyterian Church. It was supposed to be a thanks to Georgetown Hospital staff who took care of him last vear.

"We were advised by Mr. Wood that he was cancelling the concert," said Sandra Taylor, of the Georgetown Hospital Foundation, a third party organization working with Wood to help organize the event.

The hospital foundation refunded the tickets that were sold.

Wood was released on recognizance. He is expected to appear in court on April 23.

The changes, launched on April 2, are giving residents more options and allowing them to recycle more products.

Here are five things you need to know about the blue box recycling enhancements

Halton residents can now recycle plastic bags.

Along with plastic bags, residents will be able to include plastic wrapping, such as that which typically packages toilet paper rolls.

Residents will not be restricted to solely using their blue bins.

Residents will have the option to leave their recycling in blue bins, clear plastic bags or a combination of the two. There are no limits to the number of bags or bins each resident can place outside for collection

bag, prior to combining with other recyclables.

Recyclables should be rinsed.

All recycling products must be clean and dry prior to being placed out for collection.

Check your bags before recycling.

When recycling plastic bags, check inside. Make sure they are free of any items such as receipts or cardboard.
