Each year the region of Halton undertakes a financial review of the area from business investment to commercial and industrial real estate statistics.

Five highlights from the 2017 economic re-

1) Halton's unemployment rate dropped to four per cent in 2017, which is below the national average of 6.4 per cent.

2) Construction values grew in the region. The value of industrial development increased from \$64.4 million to \$117.4 million in one year, and residential construction values grew from \$1.3 billion to \$2.2 billion - nearly double.
