2 males arrested following distraction theft

Two male suspects have been arrested and charged for distraction theft, after they were spotted at the same Georgetown location of Food Basics twice in two days, Halton police said.

The first incident took place on April 3, when two males entered Food Basics on Guelph Street, allegedly distracted a female shopper and stole from her purse, police said. Halton police reported that same day, the two males were found to have attended Food Basics locations in Milton and Burlington as well, where they allegedly stole other shoppers' purses. Police say credit cards were used shortly after each theft.

On April 4 around 1:35 p.m., employees from Georgetown's Food Basics recognized the same two suspects from the day prior, and

contacted police. Officers were able to stop the pair on the road around 4:10 p.m. and the men were subsequently arrested. Both have been charged with three counts of theft under \$5,000. Bogdan Dymiter, 20, of Brampton and a 17-year-old, who cannot be named under the Youth Criminal Justice Act, were held pending a bail hearing.
