Region changes tune on Hornby water servicing

Last month, a report recommending staff do more study on wells in Hornby was deferred at Regional council.

It suggested that council should direct staff to conduct a door-to-door assessment of the state of water services in the area of Hornby Road, just north of Steeles Avenue, where residents for years have lived with well water problems associated with construction in the area.

Now, a report is coming to Regional council advising that services should be extended to residents in the area, with a budget of \$200,000 for the project.

"The region always thought the wells would come back," said Clark Somerville, regional coun-
