care for a few hours each day and has a full-time nurse to take care of her while she's there.

Corley says he has about five to six doctor's appointments to bring her to each month and travels for each, to SickKids Hospital in Toronto, as well as the Credit Valley Hospital in Mississau-

When she gets sick, we can't go to the Georgetown Hospital unless it's something minor. We have to go to SickKids," he added. So when Corley got into a collision on June 22

and his previous vehicle was written off, he knew he had to act fast and find a replacement.

His father decided to surprise him and take him to Georgetown Toyota where he helped him purchase a used Hyundai Tucson. Toyota told the family they would have to take the vehicle elsewhere to get it certified.

Corley said they paid just over \$3,000 for the vehicle and when he took it to get certified, amazing for he found out he would have to pay an additional \$3,000 for repairs.
