The Halton Climate Collective is hosting a dinner discussion on Tuesday evening at the Hillsview Active Living Centre in Georgetown to talk about environmental challenges in the community.

"The team has been put in place to look at our local greenhouse gas emissions," said Lisa Kohler, with the Halton Climate Collective. "We're trying to get ahead of the challenge.'
