The town of Halton Hills is joining forces with environmental leaders in the community, and they want advice from the public on tackling climate change.

The Halton Climate Collective is hosting a dinner discussion on Tuesday evening at the Hillsview Active Living Centre in Georgetown to talk about environmental challenges in the community.

"The team has been put in place to look at our local greenhouse gas emissions," said Lisa Kohler, with the Halton Climate Collective. "We're trying to get ahead of the challenge."

She says that with over 70 applicants registered, Halton Hills is definitely showing a strong interest in making local changes.

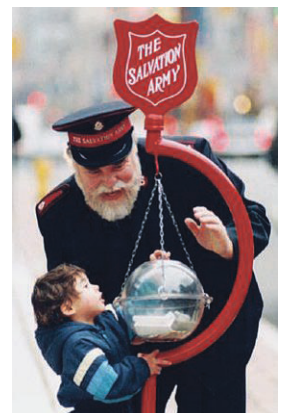
