Do you know how to help prevent crime in your community?

Halton regional police are kicking off Crime Prevention Week, which runs from Nov. 4 to Nov. 10.

"We know from experience that crime prevention works. When police partner with community agencies and engage with their residents to stop crime in its tracks, everyone wins," said Chief Stephen Tanner.

Police will be promoting crime prevention throughout the week with the support of Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police, as well as the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services.

Crime prevention efforts can focus on a number of different issues, from opioid use in communities, cyber-

fraud, gun amnesty programs and even guidance on legal marijuana use.

"We are proud that Halton Region has maintained the lowest crime severity index in Canada for 13 straight years. But the bolstering of community safety and well-being takes hard work and collaboration," said Tanner. "That's why the Halton Re-

gional Police Service is proud to partner with government, community leaders, young people, and businesses to prevent crime throughout our community."

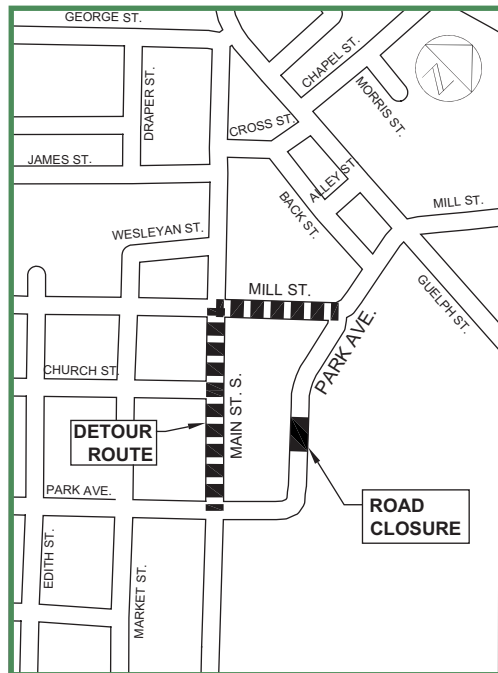
Police will be making more announcements through the week on community partnerships on crime prevention.

Access for local residents will be maintained at all times.

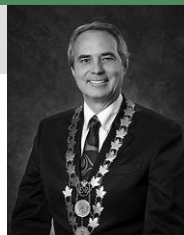
