Jocelyn Tost, Bruce and Denis McCartney and has always given credit to his sisters for giving him the name "Butch" so many years ago.

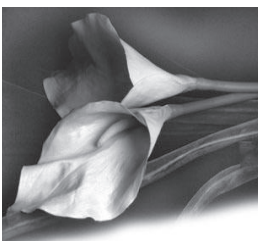

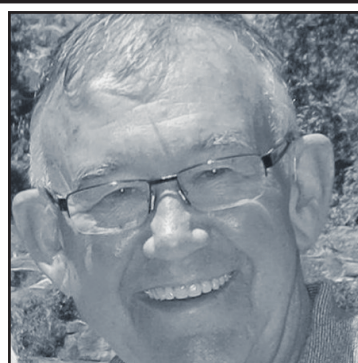
