- Garden and tree trimmings
- Leaves





Unacceptable materials

- · Flower / plant markers and tags
- Gardening tools
- Kids and pet toys
- Plastic bags
- Plastic flower / plant pots
- Sod, soil, rocks
- Tree stumps / trunks







Yard waste can also be dropped off for composting at the Halton Waste Management Site, 5400 Regional Road 25, Milton. Fees will apply. The Halton Waste Management Site is open Monday to Saturday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Visit halton.ca/waste for more information, fees and instructions.
