My spouse and I have 2 young children. I am under 40 and healthy. Do I need a Will and Power of Attorney?

A

Without a will upon your death the Succession Law Reform Act determines who gets your estate not you. If family members argue over who gets your children then a judge determines what is best for your children without your input. If you become incompetent then the Public Guardian determines where you will live, and what will be done with your assets rather than a trusted person you have chosen to make your decisions.
