SOUTH GEORGETOWN SHOOTING WAS TARGETED, SAY POLICE

Halton police say they believe the shooting at a home in south Georgetown Tuesday afternoon was not a random act.

"We don't believe there's any risk to the public at this time," said Staff Sgt. Chris Lawson following reports of shots being fired on Garrison Square.

Police officers, along with the tactical rescue and canine units, were dispatched to the scene near the intersection of Mountainview and Argyll roads around 4 p.m. Tuesday.

Several casing were recovered from the street in front of the targeted home and bullet holes were visible in a BMW parked in the driveway.

Police say nobody was home at the time of the incident.

There are no reports of injuries. The shooter fled the scene in a white or silver newer model Honda Accord or Hyundai, police say

The shooter, who was seen with a black handgun, is described as male, approximately five-foot-nine, wearing a dark hoodie with possibly a darker-coloured jacket. No further description is currently available.
