ARTISANS' ATTIC CLOSING ITS DOORS AT **END OF MARCH**

Georgetown's Main Street will be a bit less colourful soon as Artisans' Attic Gallery and Gifts prepares to shut down.

The local artists' co-operative will close its doors on March 30, bringing to an end almost a quarter century of selling handmade items in the downtown core. The group currently shares a storefront with Dini & Co, which will continue operat-

"We are so very sorry to be leaving Main Street. The community has always been so supportive to us over all these vears." said watercolour artist Susan Little. "It's really been a thrill for us to be part of this artisan co-operative. I loved getting to work alongside such dynamic, creative and clever women."

The climbing cost of rent for Main Street store space has become too much for the group to carry, explained wildlife and na-


