## Spring waste reminders, events and tips

Halton Region offers many ways to manage your household waste and contribute to community waste reduction.

### Waste reminders and tips

Help keep your neighbourhood clean and prevent materials from blowing away on windy days:

- ✔ Use a clear plastic bag for recyclables.
- ✔ Place heavier recyclables on top of your Blue Box.
- ✔ Place materials at the curb by 7 a.m. on your collection day, not the night before.
- ✔ Bundle and tie paper material.



### Yard waste collection resuming

Starting the **week of April 1**, yard waste will be collected every other week on the same day as garbage.

- ✔ Only use paper yard waste bags or a rigid reusable container with a yellow yard waste label.
- ✘ No plant pots, soil bags or plastic bags
