PROJECT RURAL IMPACT NETS ALMOST 500 SPEEDING CHARGES

Local residents who chose to speed through the rural area last month are paying the price.

Halton regional police handed out 497 speeding tickets in the Milton and Halton Hills country-side throughout April as part of its Project Rural Impact crack-down on aggressive driving. In addition, 29 drivers had their licences suspended and vehicles seized for seven days under the province's stunt driving legislation, meaning they were going 50 kilometres per hour or more over the posted speed limit.

"Rural speed enforcement will continue to take place throughout the year, and I'd like to encourage people to report their concerns to us," said Sgt. Paul Rudall of the 1 District response team. "We recognize aggressive driving is a concern for residents
