HALTON LEADERS JOIN FORCES TO OPPOSE CN INTERMODAL

Halton's community leaders are standing united in their opposition to CN's proposed intermodal hub in Milton.

With a federal panel review of

the matter and public hearing kicking off June 19, regional chair Gary Carr and the four local mayors held a press conference the same day in Halton council chambers to reiterate their solidarity in fighting the plans.

"We are here today to let the community know we are participating in the public hearings to ensure our concerns and those of our residents are heard," said Carr.

The intermodal facility is proposed for CN-owned lands bordered by Tremaine Road to the west. Britannia Road to the north and Lower Base Line to the south.

It's designed to transfer containers between trucks and railcars and would operate around the clock with an estimated 1.600 daily truck trips and four intermodal trains.

With approximately 34,000 cur-
