Both Fay and Fluffy are experienced child educators. Fay, also known as JP Kane, is an educator with the Toronto District School Board. Fluffy, who also goes by Kaleb Robertson, is a child care provider and cultural producer (DJ, performer, and event host).

The program celebrates diversity and literacy in a supportive and inclusive environment. The event includes stories, songs, and laughs as the pair prove how reading is fun-damental.

"The LGBTQ community is at a higher risk of discrimination and violence," Jessica May, the mother of an 11-year-old trans advocate. "If we raise children with an open mind to different kinds of people, my community is safer."

May said while her daughter has powerful allies at school, there is a lack of understanding among other children.

"She is often questioned about her gender and genitalia and it bothers her," May said. "My view is that the exposure isn't intended to convert children, but to reveal variety and the spice of life.

"The more interactions LGBTQ people have with children, the better"

The HHPL welcomes LGBTQ+ parents, families with gender variant children, and all members of the LGBTQ+ community, as well as those who support them. All ages are welcome to attend with or without chil-

COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT TINNITUS - PART 2 DO WE KNOW WHAT TINNITUS IS??

The actual cause or event or mechanism of Tinnitus is not known. We know it is real; it is a symptom that something is wrong in the auditory system but we do not know what that something is. We do know that it is not the patients imagination; it is a physiological or neurological event. There is reason to be hopeful because current research using a Tinnitus model may provide the necessar information for identifying it's cause.
IS IT ASSOCIATED WITH HEARING LOSS?

In most cases. Tinnitus is associated with some hearing loss. For example, those who have been exposed to excessively loud sounds may have a hearing loss for the high pitched tones. Usually their Tinnitus will be located as a high pitched tone in the region of the hearing loss. In some cases Tinnitus is present where there is no hearing loss and for no discernable reason. 
