

# It's Our Own Garbage

## What We Did in 2018

Thank you Halton residents!

By participating in Blue Box, Green Cart, Yard Waste, Reuse and Household Hazardous Waste programs, as well as diversion programs at the Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS), Halton residents continue to have one of the highest residential waste diversion rates in Ontario. In 2018, 58 per cent of residential waste was diverted from the HWMS landfill.

Also, through our shared commitment, we have helped to extend the lifespan of the landfill from 2012 to between 2044 and 2048 - over 30 years longer than expected. This has saved taxpayers more than \$15 million by deferring the costs of building a new site.

## Joint Municipal-Regional Waste Management Committee

The Committee was established as a Condition of Approval for the Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS) when it opened in 1992. The Committee is comprised of members from Burlington, Halton Hills, Milton and Oakville. The Committee advises Halton Regional Council regarding programs and strategies to promote the 3Rs – reduce, reuse, recycle – encourage community recycling and minimize the amount of waste going to the landfill. In 2018, the primary focus was to update Committee members about changes to the Blue Box program, the programs being changed or implemented under the *Waste Free Ontario Act* and the Food and Organic Waste Framework and the consultation process.



## Diversion Results

Here is a summary of waste material diverted from the Halton Region landfill site in 2018.

- Blue Box: 50,612 tonnes
- Green Cart: 28,343 tonnes
- Yard Waste: 34,466 tonnes
- Household Hazardous Waste: 826 tonnes
- Electronic Waste: 330 tonnes
- Other: 20,440 tonnes

We diverted more waste than we landfilled: 135,017 tonnes! Total garbage landfilled at the Halton Waste Management Site: 74,291 tonnes.

- Battery Recycling Depots
- Household Hazardous Waste Depot
- Salvation Army Reuse Depot
- Blue Boxes and Green Carts delivered to new subdivisions and free replacements for all residents
- Continued implementation of the Green Cart Program into Apartments and Condominiums
- Using GPS technology to optimize space at the landfill.
- Space-saving reusable tarps as an alternative daily cover at the landfill

### Advocacy for Extended Producer Responsibility under the Waste Free Ontario Act

In collaboration with our neighbouring municipalities, Halton Region has advocated to the Provincial government resulting in legislation that has enabled increased support from industry for the proper recycling and disposal of material through the following programs:
