WHAT DO THE ELECTION RESULTS MEAN FOR HALTON HILLS?

It was business as usual in Halton Hills as voters re-elected Conservative MP Michael Chong for a sixth term.

But the figures below the surface locally may suggest a coming shift in voter ideologies.

While Chong earned his reelection with 47.7 per cent of the vote in this election, that figure is about three per cent lower than the 2015 election and could signify a decline in his or the party's popularity.

The Liberals also experienced a dip at the polls, receiving 28.3 per cent of the vote in Wellington-Halton Hills with candidate Lesley Barron compared to 36.5 per cent in the previous election.

But the decline in numbers for the only parties that have ever
