

COUPLE ALLEGED TO HAVE STOLEN JACKET AFTER UNSUCCESSFUL EXCHANGE

Police are looking to identify a pair of shoppers who attempted to return unsold merchandise for store credit.

When that didn't work, they allegedly just stole it.

Suspect photos were recently released of the Dec. 8 incident, in which police report that a man and woman entered the Roots store at Toronto Premium Outlets (13850 Steeles Ave.) and selected a jacket valued at \$198. The pair then concealed the jacket in a reusable shopping bag and attempted to exchange the unpaid coat for other items.

When an employee refused to make the exchange without a receipt the man and woman allegedly exited the store with the jacket.

The first suspect is a woman, possibly South Asian, in her 50s. She stands about five feet five inches tall and weighs about 190 pounds, with brown

eyes and short, brown hair. She was wearing a black parka with faux fur on the hood, with black pants and glasses.

The other suspect is a man, possibly South Asian, in his 50s, about five feet 10 inches tall and 200 pounds. He was wearing a blue jacket with a blue shirt, blue jeans, blue cap and glasses.
