## OLD CHRISTMAS TREES COLLECTED TO HELP ENVIRONMENT

With the holidays over for another year, dozens of Halton residents took advantage of a one-day Christmas tree drop-off program to help the environment.

Residents made the trek to Conservation Halton's Crawford Lake Conservation Area to dispose of 175 used Christmas trees, far surpassing the 30 or so holiday trees donated last year.

This is the second year the program was open to the public, with the previous five years catering exclusively to local nurseries and the City of Hamilton displays - 500 trees in total being donated.

"The trees create new creek/river banks that improve water quality and the availability of fish habitat" said Kent Rundle, coordinator of Landowner Outreach Restoration with Conservation Halton.
