- The crane is required to construct the foundation for new overhead hydro service power lines from Churchill Road into the wastewater treatment plant.
- The work is part of the plant's expansion project to accommodate growth in

the community and maintain reliable wastewater services.

- The expansion is anticipated to be complete in late 2020. However, the crane is not expected to be on site for the entire duration of the work.

Do I need a lawyer near the property I am buying or selling?

As long as the property is located in Ontario, you can use any real estate lawyer in Ontario. The Land Registry Office can be accessed electronically so registering the Transfer (ie: Deed) is done electronically (with rare exceptions). So you can use a local lawyer to buy or sell a cottage property or rental property that may be two or three hours away.

If you are buying or selling a property outside of Ontario, you will need a lawyer who practices real estate law in that province. However, if you do not plan on travelling out of province, you can still use a local lawyer to act as your notary/ witness for the closing documents that need to be signed.
