- The crane is required to construct the foundation for new overhead hydro service power lines from Churchill Road into the wastewater treatment plant.

- The work is part of the plant's expansion project to accommodate growth in

the community and maintain reliable wastewater services.

- The expansion is anticipated to be complete in late 2020. However, the crane is not expected to be on site for the entire duration of the work.

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**Q Do I need a lawyer near the property I am buying or selling?**

**A** As long as the property is located in Ontario, you can use any real estate lawyer in Ontario. The Land Registry Office can be accessed electronically so registering the Transfer (ie: Deed) is done electronically (with rare exceptions). So you can use a local lawyer to buy or sell a cottage property or rental property that may be two or three hours away.

If you are buying or selling a property outside of Ontario, you will need a lawyer who practices real estate law in that province. However, if you do not plan on travelling out of province, you can still use a local lawyer to act as your notary/witness for the closing documents that need to be signed.
