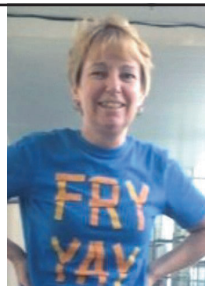


**PHILPOTT, Margaret Elizabeth**
