#### **PURCHASE FRESH FROM LOCAL FARMS**

A local farm market, the Hen House, will continue operating despite the pandemic.

"There will be some changes

with pick up to keep with social distancing," Amber Smiley, owner of the Hen House, said. "I imagine there will be more deliveries required as well."

Smiley said she expected the first baskets of produce to be ready in the first week of June.

The family — Smiley, her husband, Jeremy Knapp, and three daughters — have lived on the 44-acre farm since 2015.


In addition to produce baskets, the family also sells eggs at their farm.
