AT-HOME EDUCATION: IS IT WORKING?

Ontario education is in the midst of a great experiment.

In March 2020 schools were closed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and the primary source of education for students since then has been through distance learning.

The massive rollout of e-learning required schools to scramble to accommodate the new reality of teaching outside of a brickand-mortar institution.

How exactly this version of schooling looks varies from teacher to teacher and school to

school but generally, instruction is given through an online portal and students are expected to do everything, from readings to completing assignments and checking out virtual tours.

Pat Daly, director of education with the Halton Catholic District School Board, said the goal is to ensure the successful completion of the school year and for teachers to able to customize how they conduct distance learning.

ing. "The mechanism of delivery from teacher to teacher in this format is probably not too different than it would be in a regular face-to-face format," said Daly. "While we do try to stress consistency, it does vary classroom to classroom. Our hope here would be teachers are doing their best to provide continuity of learning."

Teachers are encouraged to create an online presence to fos-
