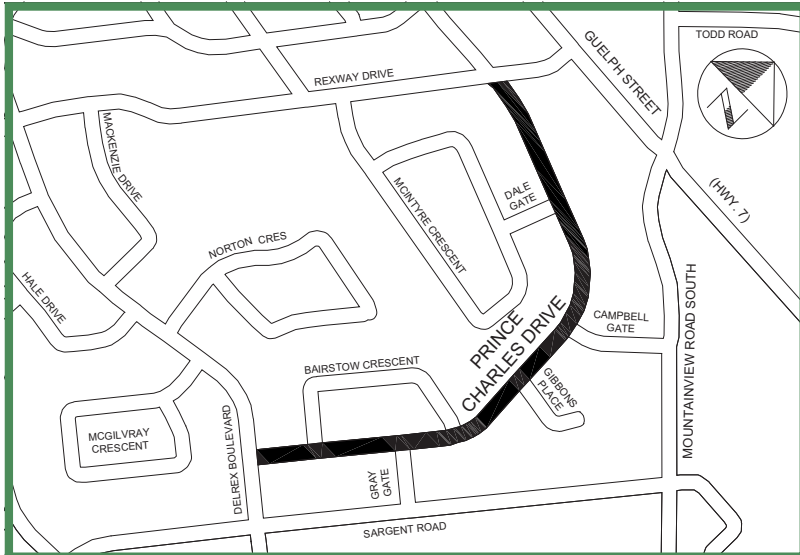

TOWN CLARIFIES WHICH BUSINESSES ELIGIBLE TO REOPEN

The Town of Halton Hills staff held a teleconference with representatives from the Halton Hills Chamber of Commerce, and the Acton and Georgetown BIAs to provide clarification on the provincial announcement about reopening retail businesses.

Here is the agreed-upon interpretation of the provincial announcement:

- Retail stores eligible to reopen applies only to self-contained businesses. To reopen, businesses must have their own individual entrances and exits, either to a public road or parking lot, to provide curbside pickup and delivery.

- Businesses must have their own wash-room facilities for staff.

- Retail businesses within enclosed shopping malls or plazas, without their own entrance and exit access to a public road or parking lot, are not permitted to offer curbside pickup under current regulations.

The participants in the teleconference also addressed other issues, including the

lack of availability of wireless payment units, the profitability of opening in this manner and securing employees to return to work.

"I am hearing stories of people who, out of concern for their own health, are being disrespectful to others.
