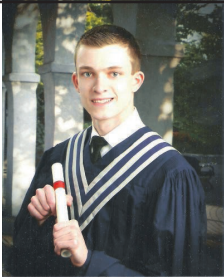

YAKE, Donald Albert "Don"

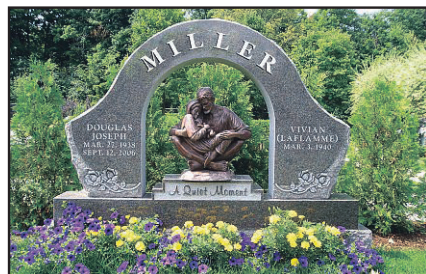
