The age limit for the Youth Taxi Scrip program has increased, allowing a larger portion of young people in Halton Hills to use the program.

"Until such time when we have a local transit system, it's important that we continue to leverage opportunities to support easy and affordable means to travel throughout the community," said Mayor Rick Bonnette.

The program provides registered riders between the ages of 13 and 24 a 40 per cent discount on regular taxi fares with participating companies. Previously, the age of eligibility was for youths up to age 19.

An ActiVan application for youth form must be completed in order to participate in the program.

Taxi scrip books are available for \$12 with a face value of \$20. Registered users may purchase up to four taxi scrip books per month from the following
