NORTH HALTON MAYORS WEIGH IN ON LOCKDOWN

Halton is back in lockdown.

Announced by Ontario Premier Doug Ford on Monday, Dec. 21, the province-wide shutdown brought about more stringent public health restrictions to curb the spread of the novel coronavirus.

Ford said that lockdown measures will be in place for 28 days in southern Ontario, though officials will continue to monitor the data and make an adjustment if necessary.


