HOSPITALS FUNDRAISING WITH 50/50 LOTTERIES

Two Halton hospitals have launched a virtual new way of raising funds that benefits local residents in more ways than one.

The Georgetown and Oakville hospital foundations are now running separate monthly 50/50 lotteries to raise funds for essential hospital equipment.

The Georgetown lottery started in November with a guaranteed prize of \$5,000 that will increase once gross sales hit \$10,000. November's winner took home \$6,805, while December's won \$6,705.

Meanwhile, the Oakville lottery kicked off this month and is offering a guaranteed prize of \$7,500.
