COVID VACCINE NOW AVAILABLE FOR RESIDENTS 60 AND UP

More local residents have been added to the eligibility list for a COVID-19 vaccine at one of Halton Public Health's clinics established throughout the region. Those 60 years old and up, born in or before 1961, can now book an appointment for the inoculation. Appointments are available in April and can be secured through Halton's online booking system at halton.ca/COVIDvaccines. Those who need assistance can call 311.

In addition to those aged 60 and up, the following groups are also currently eligible for vaccines: Indigenous adults aged 55 and older, adults receiving chronic home care through a Local Health Integration Network or a home-care agency, staff and essential caregivers from long-term-care or retirement homes in Halton who haven't received their first dose, and health-care workers who live or work in Halton that provide direct, non-virtual care at least once a week.

Halton residents are allowed to schedule an appointment at any location within the region that's most convenient to them. The clinics are located at the:
