## TRAIN HORNS AT TRAFALGAR CROSSING TO BE SILENCED

A railway crossing in north Georgetown is slated to have train whistles permanently prohibited.

Regional council passed a motion during its most recent meeting to stop trains from blowing their horns at the Trafalgar Road IMPACTING YOUR COMMUNITY

crossing between Lindsay Court and 20th Sideroad.

While there's still more paper-

work and legal documents to be signed between Halton Region, the Town of Halton Hills and railway corridor owner Metrolinx, followed by Transport Canada issuing an order to prohibit whistling, it's expected that all steps will be finalized by the end of summer.

The impending silence is music to the ears of residents who

live nearby, many of whom have been fighting for a long time to have the whistles stopped after they noticed a change in the frequency of trains and horns on the line.

Area resident Susan Gordon spearheaded the cause years ago, largely to make her late husband
