

NFWS WEEKLY ROUNDUP: HALTON YOUTH **CAN NOW GET COVID-19 VACCINE**

Halton Public Health has opened up COVID-19 vaccine bookings for youth between 12 and 17.

Those eligible can book appointments at Halton vaccination clinics that offer Pfizer vaccine through the region's online booking system for both the first and second shot. As per the provincial direction, the first doses will be offered in June, with the second doses offered by the end of August - depending on supply.

Youth must have had their 12th birthday on or before the date of the first shot.

dose of COVID-19 dose, representing 64 per cent of the population, according to data from the public health unit.

As for the weekly CO-VID-19 cases, the region's website shows that from May 21 to 27 there were 228 new cases, another notable decrease from the previous week. The disease claimed three more lives, bringing the death toll to 224.

As of May 28, the num-

ber of active COVID-19 cases stood at 334 - with 125 cases in Burlington, 112 in Milton, 67 in Oakville, and 30 in Halton Hills. There have been 17,462 cases of COVID-19 during the pandemic, with 16,904 marked as resolved.
