TEEN DROWNS IN CREDIT RIVER

A teenaged boy drowned in Halton Hills Friday evening (June 11).

Police say the drowning occurred around 5 p.m. in the Credit River near Mac-Nab Park in Norval.

The child, identified as a 14-year-old Brampton boy, was swimming with friends at the time, police said.
