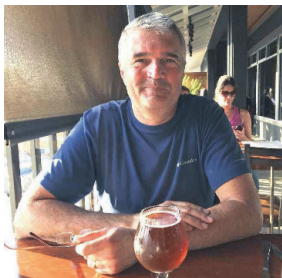

Our family mourns the loss of our beloved Jim, whose life was defined by kindness, humour, generosity of spirit and love of adventure.

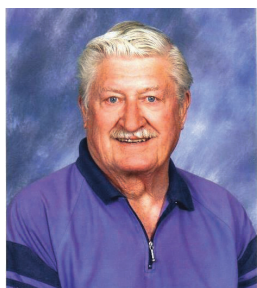
Jim began life on a farm in Saskatchewan and grew up to travel the world, always returning to his family to share what he had seen and tell us about the people he had met along the way.
