- Plastic plant pots and trays



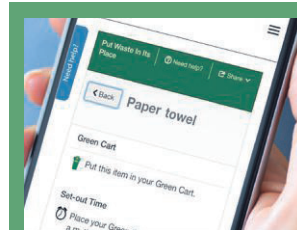
#### Items for Green Cart

### Collection reminders:



Please bag and tie all garbage material. **Loose items will not be collected.**

Please wrap all mattresses and box springs in plastic before placing at the curb for bulk waste collection.



Please ensure your bin is sized and designed to be easily collected by crews:

- 23 kg (50 lbs) or less
- 125 litres or less (27 imperial gallons)
- 50 cm wide x 100 cm high (20 inches wide x 39 inches high)
- removable lid

### Taking steps to support meaningful Indigenous relationships in Halton

On June 16, 2021, Regional Council approved actions to build and foster reciprocal relationships with Indigenous Peoples, including endorsing the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Report and Calls to Action, and the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. Council also approved an Indigenous Land Acknowledgement, permanently flying the flag of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation at Halton Regional Centre, and supported the ongoing work of an Indigenous Advisory Group. Endorsing these actions is a step in the right direction, but we know that more work still needs to be done. I look forward to continuing these efforts together.

## PUBLIC SCHOOL BOARD APPOINTS NEW SUPERINTENDENTS

Three new superintendents have been announced for the Halton District School Board, to replace three members of the senior administrative team who are retiring.

The three retiring superintendents are Mark Zonneveld, Julie Hunt Gibbons and John Pennyfather.
