Legal Notices Required Under the Planning Act:

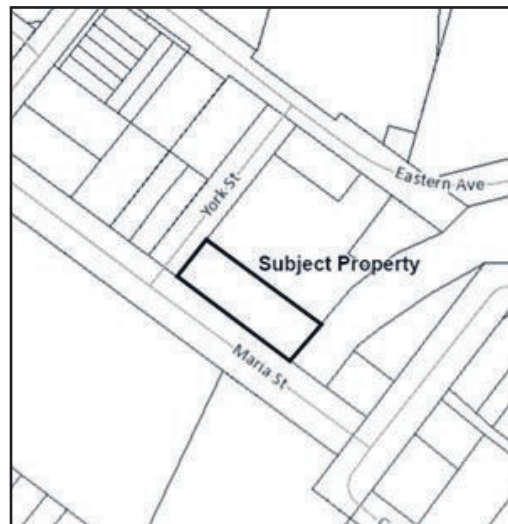
1. If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of Town of Halton Hills Council to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted and the by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.
2. If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted and the by-law is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

Any written comment/objection submitted to the Town of Halton Hills regarding these applications which are being processed under the Planning Act, may be made public as part of the application process.

HALTON HILLS HYDRO NAMES NEW PRESIDENT

A new president and chief executive officer has been chosen for Halton Hills Hydro. Scott Knapman will join the municipally owned energy supplier on July 5.

Knapman, current CEO of Festival Hydro and Festival Hydro Services Inc., based in Stratford, has more than 30 years of experience in both the energy and telecommunication sectors.

"Given the Town's advancement in the areas of climate change, adaption and mitigation, I am pleased that we have secured Scott who brings with him in-depth knowledge about green energy and technology along with extensive board governance experience," Mayor Rick Bonnette, also the chair of the Halton Hills Community Energy Corporation, said.

Mick O'Sullivan, chair of the Halton Hills Board of Directors, noted Knapman's background in overall business operations and strategic leadership experience will serve him well in the role.

Knapman's prior experience includes vice president roles at Bell Canada, Telus, and Alectra Energy Solutions. He was also a founding board member of the Canadian Internet Registration Authority.

"I am very excited to be joining Halton Hills Hydro," Knapman said. "The relationship of hydro to the municipality is one that I feel strongly about and believe that I can help advance the green agenda and deliver economic benefit to our stakeholders and the community at large."

Former president and CEO of Halton Hills Hydro, Art Skidmore, retired as of April 30, 2020.

Skidmore, accepted a role as president of GridSmartCity and the GridSmartCity Cooperative, a consortium of local distribution companies across southern Ontario.
