# WEEKLY ROUNDUP: OFFICIALS HOPE FOR TWO-DOSE SUMMER FOR MORE RESIDENTS

With an increase in the COVID-19 vaccine supply, Halton health officials are urging residents to get their first and second doses of the vaccine as soon as possible to help prevent a fourth wave.

"We are in a race against COVID-19 and its variants. We need to get everyone fully vaccinated to avoid a fourth wave in the fall," said Dr. Hamidah Meghani, Halton Region's Medical Officer of Health. "Make it a two-dose summer - get your second dose to gain better protection against COVID-19 and the Delta variant as soon as possible. We need 90 per cent fully vaccinated and every dose counts."

According to the latest

update, 81 per cent of Halton residents have received the first COVID-19 vaccine shots with 62 per cent now fully vaccinated.

As for the weekly COVID-19 cases, the region's website shows that from July 16 to 22 there were 47 new cases, up from 44 the previous week. Two more deaths were reported in Burlington.

As of July 23, the number of active COVID-19

cases stood at 45 — with 21 cases in Burlington, 11 in Milton, seven in Halton Hills, and six in Oakville. There have been 18,142 cases of COVID-19 during the pandemic, with 17,861 marked as resolved and 236 deaths.
