ELLIS, Clare Marie



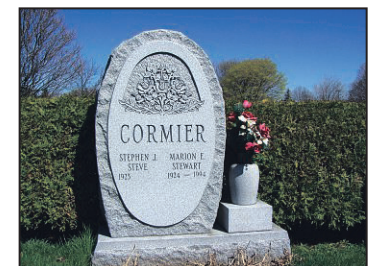
